#### **Spring Meeting 2019**

Dear AGO Friends,

Christmas 2018 is already done, Easter is in a couple of months and directly after that - the Spring Meeting 2019 in Poland.

Time: Mon.-Sat., April 22-27, 2019 Place: Warsaw and vicinity

You can look for convenient flights to the Chopin or Modlin Airport, both in Warsaw.

#### **Itinerary Outline**

Our Meeting will begin, as usual, with the Opening dinner on Easter Monday evening.

On Tuesday we will visit three church organs in Warsaw: a Baroque-style organ in St. Anna's church (Pflüger, 1992, 30/2/P), a "universal" organ in the Cathedral (Eule, 1987, 60/3/P) and the symphonic organ of the Military Cathedral (Mentzel-Schlag&Söhne-Sauer-Kamińscy, 1729-1882-1905-2005, 52/3/P). At the end of the day we will visit the Vodka Museum and will be able to taste the best Polish vodkas ever created!

Wednesday will begin with a coach ride to the largest organ in Poland (4<sup>th</sup> in Europe, 13<sup>th</sup> in the world) in Licheń (Zych, 157/6/P) and after to The Rubinstein Philharmonic in Łódź where we will see two interesting concert organs: one in baroque style by Wegscheider (2014, 37/2/P) and one in symphonic style by Rieger (2015, 66/4/P).

Thursday we will visit the instrument in the Warsaw Philharmonic (Schuke, 2001, 71/3/P) and one of the oldest Polish organs in the beautiful city of Kazimierz Dolny (Liliusz, 1620, 35/2/P) and for dessert the newly restored organ in the Protestant Church in Warsaw (Schlag und Söhne, 1900, 24/2/P).

Friday Morning we will spend in the workshop of the largest Polish organ builder Zych in Wołomin. After that we will visit one of the first instruments in Poland made in French symphonic style located in All Saints Church in Warsaw (Zych, 2002, 65/3/P). After lunch we will go to the Jewish Museum 'Polin', where we will be able to see the complex history of Polish country.

The official agenda of the Spring Meeting will conclude with the Closing Dinner on Friday evening, April 26<sup>th</sup>.

If you are able to stay in Warsaw for Saturday we have the opportunity to see the city from the 31<sup>st</sup> floor of the highest communistic building in the city and also be able to attend the Polish National Ballet in the evening accompanied by the Orchestra of The Polish National Opera. The music will be the two Piano Concertos by Frederic Chopin, e-minor and f-minor.

## Members' News

Meredith E. Baker had retired from her position of Director of Music of the Catholic Chapel at the United States Military Academy at West Point in 2016. After over a year of subbing at marvelous churches, she

realized she was a total failure at retirement. When a previous church position opened up, she immediately sent in her resume and cover letter, and was offered the post of Organist/ChoirMaster at Christ Church, Manhasset, New York. Meredith had been at that post from 1978 through 1984, and the present Senior and Junior Wardens were then in her youth choir. She returns to the 1971 Casavant (3 manuals, 59 ranks) which needs a new console, but otherwise is doing as well as an organ of that vintage can. The parish is now much smaller than before, and the choir is an excellent ladies' choir of 6 sopranos and 3 altos! She'll tell you all about it in Warsaw next April.

Celebrating the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of STILLE NACHT, **Bernard Wayne Sanders** presented several settings of this Hymn-Tune in a *Geistliche Abendmusik* on New Year's Eve, December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2018. The program in St. Mary's in Tuttlingen included world premieres of his own "Three Nocturnes", "Pastorale", and "Ciacona", as well as a "Berceuse" composed by his brother David L. Sanders of Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

A new Mass setting which Bernard composed for a choir gathering in the Tuttlingen area has been accepted by the publishing company Dr. J. Butz Verlag of Bonn, Germany. It is scheduled to be released early 2019 and will be performed in Mühlheim by 13 choirs on October 12<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

Nicholas Will is the Director of Liturgical Music at the Pontifical North American College where he oversees all aspects of liturgical music, serves as principal organist, and directs the Seminary Choir. He is currently on a leave of absence as Assistant Professor of Music Coordinator of the Sacred Music Program at Franciscan University of Steubenville. A graduate of Duquesne University and the Peabody Conservatory of Music, Nicholas has held parish and cathedral appointments and has performed throughout the eastern United States and Europe as a soloist and

accompanist, including national gatherings of the National Association of Pastoral Musicians and the Church Music Association of America. He is currently a member of the National Association of Pastoral Musicians' national Steering Committee for Organists. His recordings as organist and conductor have been released by Navona Records and Jade Music.

# European News

**Barry Jordan**, our member in Magdeburg reports:

Some may remember the transept organ of Magdeburg, which we listened to and played in the freezing cold during the Magdeburg Spring Meeting some years ago. Even then we were talking of the

vague plans for the future of this fine organ of its time.

Commencing in 2020 the choir of the cathedral will be renovated and the organ will have to be removed. This seems to be the ideal opportunity to actually do what we have been planning; there is after all little sense in re-erecting a case which is headed for the tip, for example. All in all, the work will cost something like 350,000 Euro. The building work is scheduled to take 6 years, so I will be retired by the time the reinstallation of the organ takes place, but still, I would like to take some of the first active steps.

To this end I will be playing an **organ marathon on March 14**<sup>th</sup>. I will begin playing at 8am and play continuously until midnight (10 minute breaks every three hours are allowed). People are invited to sponsor me with a small (or large) sum per hour.
